# What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

# Three prime areas of learning and development

- Communication and Language
- · Physical Development
- · Personal, Social and Emotional Development

# Four specific areas of learning and development

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design



The three characteristics of effective learning- how young children learn-these are taken into account when we plan and guide children's activities.

- 1 Playing and exploring
- 2 Active learning
- 3 Creating and thinking critically

### Curriculum - Personal, Social and Emotional

Within this area we explore:

- Self-regulation
- Managing self
- Building relationships

Coming to school is a huge culture change for your child but with our wealth of experience of Induction into school we endeavour to ensure that our children feel happy and safe when they are with us with plenty of opportunities to develop relationships with their peers.

# Curriculum - Communication and Language

Within this area we develop skills related to:

Listening and attention;

Understanding

Speaking

These skills are vital in order to support children's learning.

For those children who have diagnosed speech and language difficulties we have our own part-time speech therapist who oversees the implementation of speech programmes.









Plenty of opportunity for role play. Use of real objects.







Time to talk together, express our feelings and opinions and problem solve as a team.

# Curriculum - Physical Development

Within this area we cover skills related to:

- Gross Motor skills
- Fine motor skills

It is really important that small children are active as this is the way they learn best.

We encourage children to engage in independent physical activities such as riding on the bikes and scooters as well as teaching them PE skills in Dance and Games.

# Outdoor learning

- Each term the children will enjoy a day at Forest School, located within easy access, on our Junior school grounds.
- We have a fantastic outdoor learning space, with dedicated areas for the different areas of development and we ensure that children get outside as much as possible during the school day.
- We link the learning themes from inside and extend them outside.
- We ask that children bring suitable footwear and warm coats for the wetter weather.
















# Curriculum - Literacy


Within this area we look at developing children's basic Literacy skills of Reading and Writing. We use the 'Little Wandle' programme to develop children's Phonic knowledge and reading skills. Our Reading books have been updated to include phonics based material to support this. All classes have independent writing areas to encourage mark making, as well as access to mark making materials in all areas of the environment. We place a lot of emphasis on the teaching of basic skills, which tends to be done through small group focused teaching.

### Curriculum - Mathematics

Within this area we develop skills related to:

- Number
- Numerical patterns (Including shape, space and measures)

We place a lot of emphasis on children's problem solving skills.

Maths is taught using The White Rose Maths Scheme and Numberblocks, through daily whole class input and then differentiated small focused groups using a lot of practical resources.

# Curriculum - Understanding the World

Within this area we look at:

- Past and Present
- · People, Culture and Communities
- · The Natural World
- All our teaching is done through topics designed to motivate and inspire learning. These topics are based around the children's specific interests and a selection of rich, age appropriate texts.
- We start from what the children already know and what they would like to find out and we plan activities to develop the skills and knowledge they need.
- We use our outdoor areas as much as possible even in poorer weather

# Curriculum - Expressive Arts and Design

Within this area we develop skills related to:

- Creating with materials
- Being imaginative and expressive

Children are encouraged to create 'works of Art' which they will bring home to share with you. We also encourage children to use our themed 'Role Play' areas to develop their imagination through Drama.

We provide painting aprons - and dressing up clothes.

#### The first few weeks

We will find out what the children already know and can do and use this information to help us develop an exciting and bespoke curriculum for this year's particular cohort.

We spend lots of our time working and talking to the children about what they are learning. We may record some 'Wow' moments formally but largely we assess and move children on 'in the moment' and so not everything gets recorded.



You will be invited to discuss how your child has settled in and their progress so far at the parents evenings throughout the year.

#### The first couple of weeks

As part of effective transition into Reception, we are implementing a staggered start for the first 2 weeks.

Home visits Monday 4th - Friday 8th September

School starts on Monday 11th September

On the Monday the children will attend for a half day session only. Your child will be given either a morning or an afternoon session to allow us the time to settle them, in smaller groups.

Tuesday 12th September

All children in for the morning session at 8:45am and will stay for lunch. Please pick up your child at 1:25pm.

Monday 18th September.

All children begin school full time. School starts at 8:45 am and finishes at 3.15pm.

#### Medical Matters

- ·Any sickness, diarrhoea, must be followed by 48 hours absence.
- · Any absence requires a note or telephone call explaining why.
- ·Head lice are common! Please check regularly and treat as recommended.
- ·Any medicines can only be administered by prior arrangement

#### UNIVERSAL FREE SCHOOL MEALS

# INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION


It is our aim to ensure that you are as well informed as you can be on all aspects of your child's schooling.


To enable this we:

#### What can I do to help my child?

Whilst there are a number of adults to help and support we ask that you prepare and help your child to:

- toilet themselves we cannot wipe bottoms.
- Use a knife and fork spoons are ok to start with but lunchtimes are very hectic.
- Blow their own noses
- Say please and thank you manners are very important in our large community.
- · Coats
- Count
- Read lots of stories and poems
- Enjoy the summer on the beach/ in the woods/ garden etc
- · Name all of their uniform

#### What can I do to help my child?

#### **Enjoying books and reading**

Your child will look at books with their friends, a teacher or by themselves. Their teacher will also read to the class every day. Children will be given a reading book to take home each weekend. Read this with your child so they can discuss it with their friends and teacher the following week.

Before your child comes to school, start reading and exploring books with them every day and continue this when they start school. Studies have shown that children who are read to at home do well at school. Show them how to handle a book and sit and listen quietly so they can enjoy a story. When you read to them, stop from time to time to ask them questions about the story. This will help your child concentrate on the story and develop listening skills for when they start school.

Shaan has picked her weekend reading book to take home and read with her grown-ups.
